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Muslims are main victims of terrorism: Forum

RIYADH: A scientific forum was opened at Prince Naif University of Security Sciences in Riyadh this week to caution the public against possible abuse of the Internet to promote terrorism and extremism.

Speaking at the forum, Abdul Aziz Al-Ghamdi, president of the university, said Muslims were the largest victims of terrorism in the world. He emphasized that Islam had nothing to do with terrorism.

Prince Bandar bin Abdullah bin Mishari, director of the National Information Center at the Ministry of Interior, opened the forum, which focused on the role of the Internet in combating terrorism and extremism.

The forum was organized by the Saudi university in association with the anti-terrorism team at the United Nations, Global Counterterrorism Center in the US and the German Ministry of Interior.

Prince Bandar underscored the Kingdom's achievements in combating terrorism and extremism, referring to its pre-emptive strikes against terrorists. "We have foiled about 220 terrorist attacks in the Kingdom," he said, emphasizing the Kingdom's firm stand against terrorism. "We have become a model to follow in this field."

He also pointed out that the Arab Anti-Terrorism Agreement, which was signed during a joint meeting of Arab interior and justice ministers in Egypt in 1998, was the first of its kind in the world. The Organization of the Islamic Conference and Gulf Cooperation Council have also signed similar agreements.

"We give top priority to security cooperation with other countries to fight terrorism and other crimes," Prince Bandar said. He also referred to King Abdullah's initiative for cultural dialogue, saying it reflects the Kingdom's

ISLAMIC PARENTING: Some key Questions

Parenting has begun from the beginning of human civilization. The first parents were the first man Adam and the first woman Hawa. Both of them were Muslims. They followed Islamic parenting code prescribed by the creator Allah [swt].

Children are the future of any society. Their training begins from their own home. Parents are the main teachers for children. Islam provides a unique guideline for parents to help them in proper parenting.

In this write-up we shall answer some key questions to insight into the Islamic point of view about parenting, Insha Allah.

Q: 1. WHO GIVES US CHILDREN?

This is the most fundamental question for each parent to ask themselves, "Who gives us children?" The answer to this question has to be right to make right decision about best parenting. Parents may make guess about procedures and methods but Islam comes up with accurate answer. Islam says that the Almighty creator, the creator of everything including human gives us children. He makes us parents. Every child is being born according to His master plan. Holy Quran states: [42.49+]

"To Allah belongs the Kingdom of the heavens and the earth. He creates what He wants. He bestows female [children] upon whom He wills and bestows male [children] upon whom He wills according to His will [and His plan] Or He gives both males and females, and He leaves some whomever He wills, barren: Verily, He is full of knowledge and power."

Islam teaches that Allah is the real owner of the children. He bestows a child to the parent for a high purpose. He then gives the parents the divine code of parenting to achieve that high purpose and so on.

Q: 2. WHY ALLAH GIVES US CHILDREN?

Again every parent needs to know, why does Allah give us children?

What is the high purpose behind it? If we don't know the correct answer then how can we fulfill the purpose in parenting? Allah [swt] kindly informs the parents the purpose of giving them children in holy Quran. [8.28] "And you know that the things you own and your children are only a trial."

obligationno parent can pass the test that Allah has set for them. Success and failure in proper parenting depends on this question and its answer. The good news is that Allah has provided all the answers in Holy Quran and Sunnah. So no parents will be in the darkness about their duty as parent. Allah [swt] commands the



So the answer is: Allah gives children to test the parents. The test can be many ways like:

* Do parents remember all the time that Allah is the real owner of their children and so do they perform their duties as trustee?

* Do parents only feel proud about their children or are they grateful to Allah for the gift [children]?

* Do parents follow Allah's code [Real owner's code] in parenting or do they follow their own desires or satanic code?

* Do they love their children within the boundary Allah has allowed or do they exceed it?

* Do they become possessive in the love of their children and ignore loving the real giver Allah, and thus lose the balance in love?

Q: 3. WHAT IS THE MOST IMPORTANT DUTY ON PARENTS?

Without discharging their duty and

believers in holy Quran: [66.6]. "O you who believe, save yourselves and your families from a Fire whose fuel is men and stones."

Holy prophet [saw] says, [Narrated by Abdullah ibn Omar R.A] "Each of you are a shepherd and each of you will be questioned by Allah for your own responsibilities [In the Day of Judgment]."

So the most important job for parents is to try hard to save their beloved children from the Fire of Hell. Off course parents love their children very much but what is the real love towards children? Is the real love to try provide all the material objects and requirements for the children in this temporary life and neglecting the happiness in the everlasting life?

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OIC intra-trade to reach 20 percent by 2015

JEDDAH: Trade exchange between the member countries of the Organization of the Islamic Conference (OIC) is expected to cross 20 percent of their total trade by 2015, Dr. Ahmad Mohammed Ali, president of the Islamic Development Bank said on Sunday.

"We have already achieved an intra-trade rate of 17 percent, which is close to the 20 percent target set by the extraordinary Islamic summit held in Makkah in 2005 at the initiative of Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques King Abdullah," the IDB chief

Addressing a donors' meeting hosted by the IDB to discuss the program for regional cross border trade facilitation and infrastructure projects for Mashreq countries, Ali highlighted the bank's role in boosting trade between the OIC member countries.

He said the IDB was targeting an intra-trade rate of 30 percent for the 57 member countries. "The Standing Committee for Economic and

Commercial Cooperation (COMCEC) will set a new goal to raise the level of intra-trade to 30 percent," he added.

Since 1975 the IDB has allocated more than \$42 billion to finance trade deals between OIC countries. "This was done through intensive programs set by the bank to finance exports and imports through the International Islamic Trade Finance Corporation (ITFC) to increase the size of trade between member states as well as with other countries," he pointed out.

Shamshad Akhtar, vice president of World Bank for Middle East and North Africa Region, said persistent

unemployment among the youth, low competitiveness and productivity, and low quality of education and skills were affecting Arab economies.

The meeting looked into prospects of financing specific projects over the next five years as part of a broader 15-year program based on the recommendations of a recent World Bank study. The Mashreq region covers Egypt, Syria, Jordan, Lebanon and Palestine.

It is estimated that the proposed projects during the next five years would cost about \$300 million per year, and that the overall program would cost about \$6 billion over 15 years.

"The target projects are designed to reduce trade impediments and address major transport infrastructure constraints (both physical and non-physical barriers)," the IDB said. The World Bank has estimated that, if fully implemented, by 2020 the program could increase the total non-oil international trade of Mashreq countries by up to \$4 billion annually, and bring intra-Mashreq trade up to 22 percent of the total (compared to the current 17 percent).

It is estimated that the proposed projects during the next five

years would cost about \$300 million per year, and that the overall program would cost about \$6 billion over 15 years. These amounts are beyond the capacity of any single country or investment institution and will need to be addressed collectively.

The program will create a pipeline of projects suitable for investment under the new Arab Financing Facility for Infrastructure that was recently launched by the World Bank Group and the Islamic Development Bank. The facility will also provide a suitable framework for coordinating investments in this area.

They are isolated amongst the dominant culture. Few have the knowledge, the conviction and the confidence to conduct themselves as Muslims in such an environment. They would benefit from more interaction with other Muslimahs. We look forward to having more of such activities and hope to get the support needed.
